# SPACE IS THE PLACE: MAKING MAGIC IN THE EFL CLASSROOM

The real joy of teaching lies in the unexpected turns that lessons suddenly take, the stories, jokes and banter that suddenly burst forth from our students. Learning how to create the space in which this kind of magic can occur takes time and requires a keen focus on language. In this talk, I'll be unpicking the process.

### **HUGH DELLAR**

Hugh Dellar is a London-based teacher and teacher trainer with over twenty years experience in the field. He has taught all ages and levels, both in the UK and also in Indonesia, where he lived for four years. He worked for University of Westminster for 18 years, but is now the cofounder of Lexical Lab and has recently co-written the methodology book Teaching Lexically for Delta publishing. He is the co-author of two five-level General English series, Innovations and Outcomes, both published by National Geographic Learning, as well as numerous papers and articles for many ELT publications.

Hugh has given teacher training and development sessions in over twenty countries including Brazil, Mexico, Peru, Argentina, Spain, Russia, Italy, Japan and Thailand. 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### MICHAEL LACEY FREEMAN

I have been working in the field of English Language Teaching for nearly 30 years, both as a University teacher and ELT author. I am also a storyteller and have travelled extensively the world to tell my stories, and spread

the message that words are powerful. I have written a number of ELT course books for major publishers such as Oxford University Press and Pearson and twelve of my graded readers have been published, five of which have won international awards. # DOES PRACTICE MAKE PERFECT?

online session

Providing practice of new language is one of the key aspects of language lessons, which makes it possible for students not just to understand the new language, but be able to use it. Modern coursebooks provide a range of ready activities and guidance, but does only completing coursebook tasks lead to a desirable outcome? It is essential to understand how language practice works and how to to organise it so that students end up incorporating this language in their everyday life.

In this talk, we will focus on the stages of practicing new language (grammar, vocabulary and functions) and:

- clarify what makes language practice effective;
   discuss what types of actitivies are there to encourage students to use new language;
- explore how to skilfully manage practice activities.

The talk will be helpful for teaching professionals with some experience of teaching but will also be useful for experienced teachers who would like to structure and deepen understanding of how to make the most of language practice.

### **ANDRII PIGARIEV**

Andrii is an English language teacher and teacher trainer with over 17 years of experience in the field. He has taught English in various contexts: secondary school, General English, English for Specific Purposes and Exam English. His eagerness to take teaching English as a profession was shaped in early school years and turned into a series of decisions later. In gauging the success of English acquisition in the second language classroom, the focus has historically been placed on approaches designed by Western theorists excluding the learner's mother tongue. This approach is still supported by the ESL/EFL industry which perpetuates the myth of the native speaker. However, the world is evolving toward a diverse direction which requires a more inclusive view.

Monolingualism and nativespeakearism are obsolete concepts. Therefore, translanguaging arises as the adequate approach leading to the acquisition of an L2 from a glocal perspective. Its value cannot be underestimated.

This session is intended to be a call to action to rethink the role of educators, resignify the content of mainstream English books and to use more meaningful teaching methods. The aim of this presentation is to vindicate learners' cultural background to create a purposeful connection with the language to be learnt.

# BACKWARD DESIGN - THE END IS JUST THE BEGINNING

Increasingly implemented in secondary and tertiary education, Backward Design is an approach to course planning that enables instruction to be more goal-focused and effective by emphasizing understanding, performance, and transfer. It does this by having teachers identify their course's desired results, determine acceptable evidence of learning, and then design a progressive sequence of learning experiences to achieve the course's learning objectives. This presentation provides an introduction to Backward Design and how it helps instructors clarify their teaching practice, creates scaffolded assessments and activities, and encourages student buy-in.

### **NATHAN MEYER**

Nathan Meyer is an assistant professor at the University of Utah Asia Campus in Incheon, South Korea where he teaches writing and rhetoric and serves as chair of the Faculty Development Committee which provides ongoing professional development and pedagogical support. He earned his BA and MA from California State Universities, teaching certificates from Cambridge, Harvard, and Duke. Before joining the University of Utah, he lectured and developed courses for universities in the United States, China, and Europe. From 2014-17 he was a US State Dept. English Language Fellow in Serbia and Moldova where he was a university lecturer, curriculum developer, and teacher trainer. In continuing collaborations with the State Dept., he has built media literacy programs in Ukraine, consulted on public speaking program development in Turkey, and designed teacher training programs in Serbia, Slovakia, and Moldova.




